**FFA MANUAL #s 1 – 17**

1. Association of Public and Land Grant Universities (APLU) is one of the organizations of the National Council for Agricultural Education.
2. Over the past 88 years, FFA and agricultural education have grown to encompass all aspects of agriculture, from production farming to transportation, agribusiness and forestry to biotechnology, marketing and food processing.
3. Your Supplemental SAE might involve working after school at a farm supply store, on Saturdays at a riding stable or even in a florist shop.
4. A very focused and narrow range of activities are planned, in the POA, to meet the needs of members and the community.
5. FFA recognizes the top fifteen Outstanding Middle School FFA chapters in the National Chapter Award program.
6. In 1998, to insure that the constitution was not in conflict with the FFA Federal Charter, a technical amendment was passed by the delegates at the 72nd National FFA Convention clarifying that the name of the organization is the Future Farmers of America, but shall be known as and shall do business as the National FFA Organization.
7. Completed in 2005, the National FFA South Campus houses the merchandising, licensing, customer service and distribution departments formerly located at the FFA center.
8. In 1925, Virginia Tech agricultural education teacher educators Henry Groseclose, Harry Sanders, Walter S. Newman and Edmund C. Magill organize the Future Farmers of Virginia for boys in agriculture classes.
9. To properly conduct the salute, face the United States flag, place the right hand over the left part of the chest, and holding it there, repeat the following pledge: "I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

10. All chapter degree, officer and award medals should be worn beneath the name on the right side of the jacket, with the exception of the State FFA Degree charm and the American FFA Degree key – both of those can be worn above the name.

11. The FFA Code of Ethics was adopted by the delegates at the 1952 National FFA Convention and revised by the delegates at the 1995 National FFA Convention.

12. FFA clothing, jewelry and gift items can be ordered through the National FFA Blue catalog.

13. To be eligible to receive the Chapter FFA Degree from the chapter, a member must have satisfactorily completed the equivalent of at least 180 hours of systematic school instruction in agricultural education at or above the ninth grade level, have in operation an approved supervised agricultural experience program and be enrolled in an agriculture course.

14. Recipients in the Honorary American Degree Teacher award category are selected on the basis of their contributions in the following seven areas: classroom/laboratory instruction, experiential learning of students, National FFA Organization, building partnerships, agricultural education program marketing, agricultural education program development and evaluation, and professional development of agricultural education teachers.

15. As part of the Official Chapter Equipment 10 or more Official FFA Manuals should be available for every FFA chapter.

16. A specific duty and responsibility of the secretary is to have on hand for each meeting a copy of the POA, including all standing and special committees

17. Service-learning occurs over the course of a semester or year, makes learning more hands-on, includes intentional and structured reflection, and creates reciprocal partnerships.

18. If the motion is only to refer the item of business to a committee, it is then the responsibility of the president to appoint the committee. The presiding officer may do so during the meeting or, upon majority consent of the chapter, committee appointments may be made after the meeting adjourns.

19. Unanimous (general) consent is frequently used in situations where standing rules need to be suspended. This may be done by the president stating, "Shall we suspend, by unanimous (general) consent, the standing rule of this chapter that...?"

20. Nominations may be made by seven common methods; by the chair, by the advisor, from the floor by a member, by a committee, by ballot, by mail, and by petition.

21. Any unfinished business resulting from adjournment becomes unfinished business at the next meeting and should be taken up where it was interrupted.
22. One of the circumstances in which it is desirable to discharge a committee is when an urgent reason encourages the assembly to proceed on the question without further assistance from the committee.
23. The motion to reconsider may be amended if the motion contains multiple parts, one that a person or group wishes to cancel but the other part or parts in deemed appropriate.
24. A super-majority vote is required for adoption when the question is put to the chapter.
25. The chair of a committee is usually responsible for calling committee meetings, but they may be called by any two of its members.
26. If a committee report contains only information for the chapter members, there is no necessity for adopting the report.
27. Minutes may be corrected whenever an error is noticed regardless of the length of time that has elapsed.
28. Sine die is often used to adjourn conventions where the next convention date has been set.
29. Business (as it pertains to parliamentary law) are the items that are listed on a group's posted agenda or the items that are entertained by a group in an official meeting.
30. To "dispose of" means the removal of a motion from consideration by the assembly by Voting to Adopt, Reject, Postpone, Refer, Rescind or to lay the motion on the table.
31. Until a member relinquishes the "floor," by sitting down, the member is the only member entitled to make a motion or to speak.
32. Parliamentary procedure is the body of rules, ethics, and customs governing meetings and other operations of clubs, organizations, legislative bodies, and other deliberative assemblies.
33. Precedence is the rules of rank of the classes of motion and the priority of order which governs the order in which motions are proposed, considered and the disposition of the motions.
34. Standing committees are permanent committee's that which should be listed in the by-laws of the group or entity.
